Provisional licence.

Before you can legally drive on the road you must hold a valid provisional licence. Passing the Driving Test 1st Time.

Many people think that if they can drive then they will automatically pass their driving test 1st time, unfortunately this is not the case. The current national UK driving test pass rate is below 50%. Why is this?
